
Emerald Ash Borer



What is it? Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) is an invasive bug that has killed millions of ash trees throughout Ontario.

- Where did it come from? EAB is from Asia and was brought here in wood material.
- Cool facts: It is a small metallic green bug with a purple body under the wings.
- Where is it found? EAB is found throughout Southern Ontario and in parts of Northern Ontario and Quebec.
- What does it do? It kills ash trees and threatens forests. Ash trees can be used to make baseball bats and snowshoes.
- How can I be an Invader Raider? Buy firewood locally!

Asian Carp



What is it? Asian Carp is actually four different invasive fish: Silver Carp, Bighead Carp, Grass Carp, and Black Carp.

- Where did it come from? Asia. It was brought to the U.S. to keep ponds clean. They escaped during a flood and invaded the Mississippi River.
- Cool facts: They are large fish, and their eyes sit below or beside their mouth.
- Where is it found? Asian Carp are found in only one U.S. State. They are not yet in Canada.
- What does it do? Asian Carp eat the food that our native fish depend on and push them out of their habitats. Silver carp can jump up to 3 meters out of the water when there are vibrations from boat propellers. That can be dangerous for boaters!
- How can I be an Invader Raider?
 Don't dump live fish into Ontario lakes or rivers!

Norway Maple



What is it? Norway maple is an invasive tree.

- Where did it come from? Europe. It was brought over as a garden tree.
- Cool facts: The leaves and twigs ooze a milky sap when they are cut or torn.
- Where is it found? Throughout Ontario because it is often planted along city and town streets. It also creeps into forests.
- What does it do? It threatens woodlands because it out-competes native trees and shrubs.
- How can I be an Invader Raider?
 Garden with non-invasive plants! Red
 Maple is a great tree you can plant
 instead. The birds, bugs and animals
 will thank you!

Common Buckthorn



What is it? Common Buckthorn is an invasive shrub.

- Where did it come from? Europe. It was brought over as a garden plant and was used in fencerows on farms.
- Cool facts: Buckthorn has sharp thorns between the branches, and dark berries.
- Where is it found? Across Southern Ontario. It grows in open woods, thickets, fencerows, abandoned fields, and at road edges.
- What does it do? It invades natural areas by making shade so that native plants can't grow.
- How can I be an Invader Raider?
 Always garden with non-invasive plants!

Brook, Dusty, Flora & Tracker the pooch!


Invasive species are harmful because they disturb the balance of natural areas. They spread fast, leaving our native species fighting for food, sun and space.



Earthworm



What is it? Earthworms.

- Where did it come from? Europe and could have been brought here in soils from garden plants.
- Cool facts: Earthworms range from a few millimeters to 3 feet long, but are usually just a few inches long.
- Where is it found? Earthworms are found in soil throughout Ontario.
- What does it do? They eat the leaves that have fallen on the forest floor taking away the nutrients that are needed by plants and trees.
- How can I be an Invader Raider? Always garden with non-invasive plants and species!

Garlic Mustard



What is it? Garlic Mustard is an invasive plant.

- Where did it come from? It came from Europe as an herb.
- Cool facts: Garlic Mustard has white flowers and the young leaves smell like garlic when they are crushed.
- Where is it found? Across Ontario, in forests and yards, along trails and roadsides.
- What does it do? Spreads fast by seed and out-competes native wildflowers like Trout Lily and Trillium.
- How can I be an Invader Raider?
 Always garden with non-invasive plants!

Dog Strangling Vine



What is it? Dog-strangling Vine (DSV) is an invasive plant.

- Where did it come from? Eastern Europe, brought here as a garden plant or an accidental escapee.
- Cool facts: It's a climbing vine with fluffy white seeds that can travel by floating in the wind.
- Where is it found? Throughout Southern Ontario. It likes open sunny areas, but will grow in somewhat shady spots too.
- What does it do? It out-competes native species for sun, space and nutrients.
- How can I be an Invader Raider? Small pieces of this plant can sprout and start up a new plant, so if you wander through a patch of DSV, clean your shoes, equipment and your dog!

Water Soldier




What is it? Water Soldier is a beautiful, but invasive, water garden plant.

- Where did it come from? Europe and Northwest Asia, brought here as a water garden plant.
- Cool facts: It looks like an aloe vera plant but has sharp jagged leaf edges.
- Where is it found? Right now there is only one place in Ontario where it is found: the Trent Severn Waterway.
- What does it do? It grows in thick mats, crowding out native plants making it hard for them to grow. It can also cut swimmers and get caught in boat motors.
- How can I be an Invader Raider? Always use non-invasive plants in your water gardens like Yellow Pond Lily. When you are finished with a plant, do not throw it in the waterways! Always put it in the garbage!
